SORT IT OUT

COMMAND CENTRAL

Cell phone chargers, MP3 adapters, satellite radio units, portable GPS navigation systems, etc. There are a growing number of gadgets taking up space in the cockpit. Keep the accessories corralled (and wrap or spool their cords to keep them tangle free) in a Clever Store bin. This practical package is ideal for families with mini-athletes and young children.

ROADSIDE EMERGENCY KIT

Put a 3 Gal. Roughneck Storage Box in the trunk to hold breakdown and emergency supplies such as jumper cables, flashlight, hand-crank radio, map, a blanket, non-perishable snacks and water.

FINAL DETAILS

Vacuum the floor, mats and upholstery thoroughly, including under and between the seats, in cup holders and cubbies, to get rid of crumbs and dirt. Clean up any sticky messes and spot treat stains and ground-in dirt.
